Sanofi encourages industry to unite in support of Return Unwanted Medicines this festive season

As we head into the festive season, Sanofi is inviting the Australian healthcare industry to join them in supporting Return Unwanted Medicines (RUM), to raise awareness of the environmental impact of incorrect disposal of unused and expired medicines.

Research shows that approximately 70% of Australian adults do not know how to safely dispose of medicines, and there is low awareness that throwing away unwanted and out-of-date medicines can have a negative impact on the environment.

The RUM Project partners with pharmacies, who collect unwanted medicines via specialised bins at no cost to consumers. Returned medicines are then safely disposed of in accordance with regulatory and Environment Protection Agency requirements.

The program supports quality use of medicines and better environmental outcomes because unwanted medicines aren't disposed of inappropriately, including down the toilet or thrown out with household garbage, which may end up in waterways or landfill.

Since it started 24 years ago, The RUM Project has collected and disposed of over 12 million kgs of unwanted medicine – but there is still more out there. That's why, this season, Sanofi is giving back by encouraging industry and others to share RUM's important message as widely as possible.

Working in partnership, Return Unwanted Medicine and Sanofi have created a set of easy to use RUM branded social tiles and posts. All that industry and other healthcare organisations need to do to get involved is download the content and tiles. The festive feel of the content means it can be used any time across December or early in the New Year.
